HYPERPIGMENTATION/ **SKIN CHANGES**

Reddish/brown discoloration in the lower leg caused by hemosiderin deposition



VENOUS STASIS ULCERATION

An open, often unhealing lesion, appearing on the medial aspect of the mid-calf



Venous insufficiency in the lower leg accounts for 75% of all leg ulcers



Vein disease is 5 times more common than peripheral artery disease



Working days are lost each year due to venous ulcers
